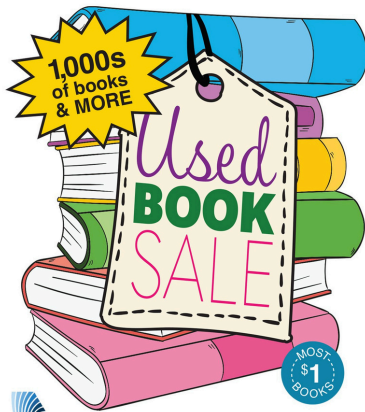
Director's Message
