### **Director's Message**

### Welcome to our Fall edition of Library Links!

We are seeing an increase in usage at the library which is wonderful. An increase in usage can also lead to higher wait times for your item requests to come in. I want to take this time to explain that a long request line doesn't always translate to a long wait. A library's local materials fill local holds first. So, a Cedarburg cardholder will jump the line, and the request will attach to Cedarburg material. What may seem like a weeks long wait, may actually be much shorter.

We have seen a huge increase in digital checkout, e-audiobooks in particular. When you place a hold in Libby for a digital book or audiobook and discover a very long wait list, be aware that our Monarch Library System may have purchased additional copies and your hold will attach to those copies and make your wait time shorter. Our library, along with other libraries in the Monarch system, is working on ways to reallocate funding to increase the amount of digital offerings and shorten wait times.

We appreciate your patience and want you to know we are addressing it—keep your requests coming!






The Board meets in the Community Room every 2nd Tuesday of the month at 7pm. The Trustee Meetings are open to the public.



### **About the Author**

Nick Petrie received his MFA in fiction from the University of Washington and won a Hopwood Award for short fiction while an undergraduate at the University of Michigan. His story "At the Laundromat" won the 2006 Short Story Contest in *The Seattle Review*, a national literary journal.

His first novel, *The Drifter*, won the ITW Thriller and Barry Awards, and was nominated for Edgar, Anthony, and Hammett Awards. He won the 2016 Literary Award from the Wisconsin Library Association and was named one of Apple's 10 Writers to Read in 2017. *Light It Up* was named the Best Thriller of 2018 by Apple Books. Both *Light it Up* and *The Wild One* were shortlisted for the Barry Award.

His books in the Peter Ash series are *The Drifter*, *Burning Bright*, *Light It Up, Tear It Down, The Wild One, The Breaker*, and *The Runaway*. A husband and father, he has worked as a carpenter, remodeling contractor, and building inspector. He lives in Milwaukee, where he is hard at work on the next Peter Ash novel.






